9. The Kissing Hand by Audrey Penn

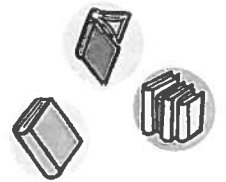
This book will help with the transition in school.

This is a rhyming read aloud.

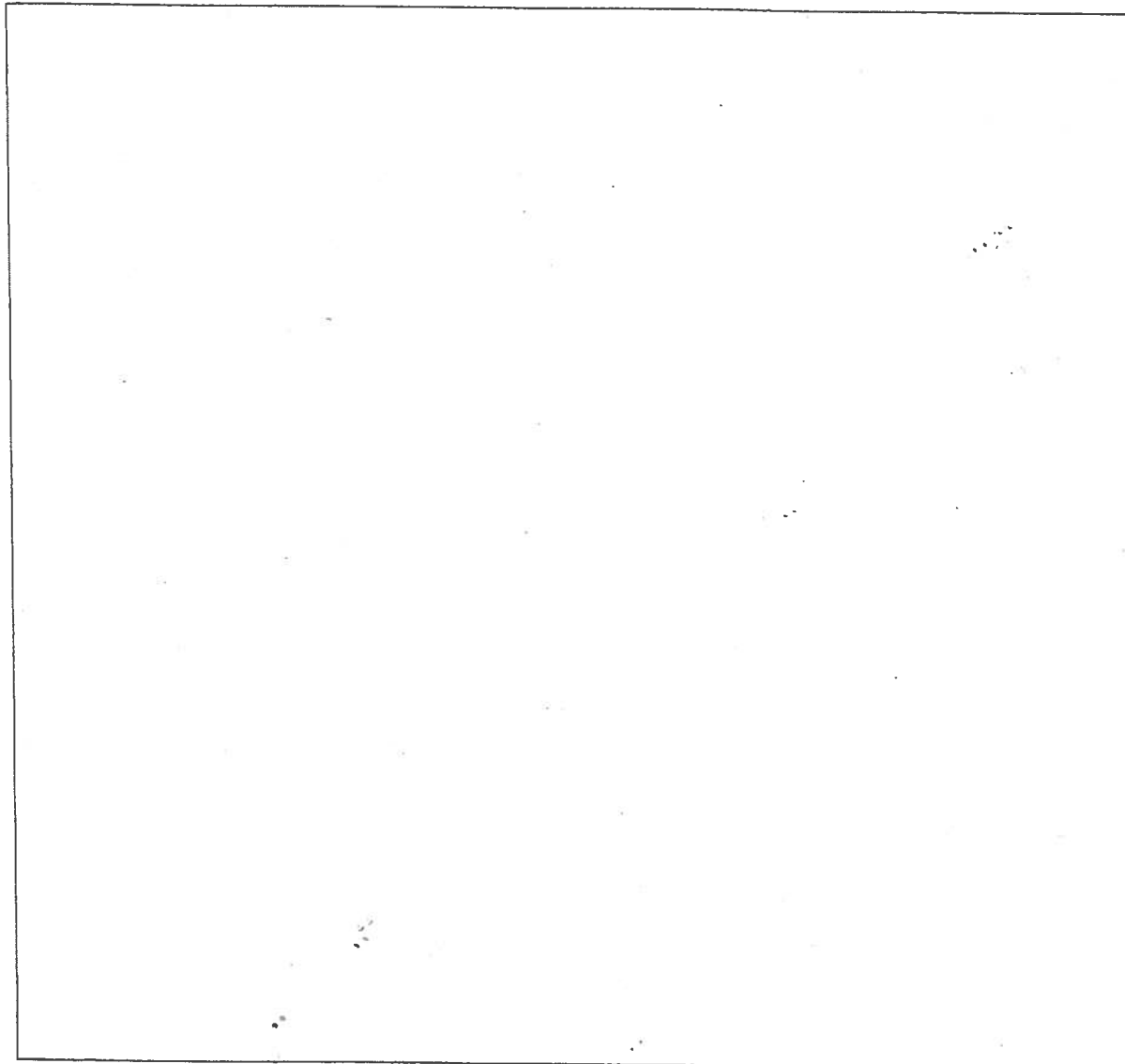
